Chapter 150: BUILDING REGULATIONS: CONSTRUCTION 150.099 FENCES, of the City of Palm Valley, Texas Code of Ordinances to address view obstruction material use.

City Attorney Jason Mann, the existing Ordinance was updated because of a lot of variance requests and approvals that would impact traffic also certain materials used in certain areas of the City. Requires that any repairs, rebuilds, or new construction of the fence would have to comply with this ordinance.

Councilman Nelson, it looks like you just added K and L?

City Attorney Jason Mann, yes, there's an amendment and the other one is new.

Councilman Lucio so does that change the houses on Dilworth to as well.

City Attorney Jason Mann, No. Because there's current language in the Ordinance about Dilworth for height (8ft) and those already exist and those aren't lots that would be impacted by the sight restrictions.
