Drainage Projects Moving Forward

Lake #3 by the sewer plant project is complete. The sprinkler system repair and hydro mulch were installed, and the project came under budget by an estimated \$8,000.

The South Drain (Golf Course) ditch construction improvement plans are still being reviewed by the Texas Water Development Board. The construction improvement plans review comments are anticipated to be complete in October.

The City Engineer, David Flinn, announced at the City Council meeting June 21st that Cameron County has some American Rescue Act Funding and his engineering firm has applied for funds to be used for the Lake

#4 by-pass project.

New City Secretary Starts October 1st

Kathy J. Cherry has been hired as the new City Secretary for the City of Palm Valley as of October 1st. Ms. Cherry has extensive professional administrative and supervisory experience in business operations in the field of financial administration, implementing departmental budget and monitoring. She is leaving her job as Departmental Finance Supervisor of the Department of Public Works for the City of Dallas. She also has experience as a Contract Manager with the City of Dallas Water Utilities.

Ms. Cherry will be working with our current City Secretary Sylvia Trevino through the end of the year.





Changes in Palm Valley

Waste Management has notified the City that the services they provide will be changing from manned trash collection twice a week to automated 96-gallon wheeled cart containers with a grapple arm truck pick-up once a week, sometime within a year. Currently, there are 434 residents that contract with Waste Management for trash collection. Discussion centers around whether the City will pass a franchise ordinance to require all 700 residents to pay for collection added to your monthly water bill or leave the open market subscription service currently in place.

Constitution Week Proclamation

On September 14, 2022, Mayor Pro Tem Eric Hoff presented a proclamation to Mrs. Taffy Herridge proclaiming September 17 to September 23 as "Constitution Week". Constitution Week is celebrated annually during the week of September 17-23 to commemorate its history, importance, and bring attention to how it serves still today. This celebration of the Constitution was started by the Daughters of the American Revolution of which Mrs. Herridge is a member.
